



Dr. Sharon L. Sullivan has degrees from Smith College, Washington University and the University of Kansas. She is a Professor at Washburn University. Her research and activism focus on violence against women and children, including sexual and domestic violence, human trafficking, and rape as a weapon of war. Sharon is cofounder and director of STARS (Stop Trafficking and Reject Slavery), a member of the Advisory Boards for the Topeka Center for Peace and Justice, the Kansas Human Trafficking Advisory Board, and the International Public Policy

Institute. She is also an active volunteer for the Topeka YWCA Center for Safety and Empowerment. Sharon co-facilitates a creative writing group for incarcerated women at Topeka Correctional Facility (TCF), the only women's prison in Kansas. Sharon has presented several times about Human Trafficking at the United Nations Commission on the Status of Women. She currently co-chairs the Topeka Shawnee County Human Trafficking Coalition.
